What is the real wealth of nations? How is the global economic system performing under increasing ecological and social pressures? Which institutions and acrors have the best opportunities to work towards building desirable and sustainable economies?

The course aims to present a variety of theoretical perspectives on issues of political economy in the context of sustainable development. Throughout the semester, different theories and historical examples are analysed and discussed in sessions with knowledges ble and inspiring guest lectures in order to offer a multidisciplinary understanding of the global economy's role in today's world. Keeping a good balance between abstract and concrete, as well as particular and general, the course constitutes a basic toolbox to understand economies in the 21st century. Embarking on this journey of discovery, international and Swedish students will reflect critically on the past and current state of the economy in order to imagine alternatives economic futures.













Micro (bottom) v Macro- (top-down) Economics

Microeconomics is the study of decisions made by people and businesses regarding the allocation of resources and prices of goods and services. It also takes into account taxes and regulations created by governments.

- Supply, Demand and Equilibrium
- Production theory
- Costs of production
- Labour economics

Macroeconomics studies the behaviour of a country (or the world) and how its policies affect the economy as a whole. It analyses entire industries and economies, rather than individuals or specific companies.

- What stimulates economic growth?
- What should the inflation/interest rates be?
- How is GDP affected by unemployment, national income, rate of growth and price levels


