## **Course Learning Outcomes**

This seminar series builds on the Introduction to Sustainable Development course and goes deeper conceptually and methodologically into the question of sustainable development.

As stated in the syllabus, upon completion of the course, the student should be able to:

- critically analyse the conceptual and practical dimensions of sustainable development at the local, regional and global level;
- critically evaluate ethical questions with relevance for sustainable development;
- critically relate to and value different actors' visions of a sustainable future.

### **Course Overview**

The course is worth 5 credits and runs every Friday from the 25<sup>th</sup> of September to the 15<sup>th</sup> of January. There is a **DRAFT** schedule for the course attached. A final schedule will be provided on Studium one week before the start of the course on Studium, the online education management



system used by Uppsala University, and the course website (http://www.cemus.uu.se/msd/).

The first session of the course will be held on Friday 25<sup>th</sup> September, 10:00-12:00 AM in Hambergsalen, Geocentrum. Maps for the building location and room are found <u>here</u> under "Geo Center."

Online attendance to sessions will be through Zoom and/or Studium. You can find the Zoom links in Studium under the course calendar.

The teaching consists of lectures, given by guest lecturers from different academic disciplines and other relevant societal sectors, and seminars run by the course coordinators. The teaching method is based on active student participation and peer-to-peer learning.

This course is being conducted in a hybrid in-person/online format due to the ongoing pandemic. While we hope that all students will have the opportunity to safely attend in person this fall, we know that this may not be possible for various reasons. Therefore, all of the content will be made available online in order to ensure that students who are unable to attend in-person have access to the same material. All graded assignments/seminars will be conducted in an online format.

#### Course Examination

As stated in the syllabus:

The student is examined through written preparation for (1 credit) and active participation in seminars and workshops (1 credit), and through written documentation (2.5 credits) and oral presentation (0.5 credits) of a project.

If there are special reasons for doing so, an examiner may make an exception from the method of assessment indicated and allow a student to be assessed by another method. An example of special reasons might be a certificate regarding special pedagogical support from the University's disability coordinator.
