


CLIMATE CHANGE LEADERSHIP

Welcome to Climate Change Leadership 2021!

Climate change leadership is often mentioned in both news media and by politicians themselves, but what does it really entail? What kind of knowledge and skills define a climate change leader and how can they be learned? We are very excited to have you with us and to explore these questions over the next four months.

Registration

As indicated in your acceptance letter, you need to register for the course on Ladok (https://www.student.ladok.se/). Registration opens approximately a month before the course begins and you have to register before the course starts to keep your place. More information on how registration works can be found here. Course start date & structure

The first class of the course will take place on the 15th of Septmeber from 15:00-17:00 in Hamberg, Geocentrum. (Click here for a map). There will also be an opportunity to join this class online for anyone who is not able to attend physically, the zoom link will be released closer to the time. This will be the only in-person class, except for a final in-person meeting on the 13th of January from 13:00-15:00 which will be at the same location. Aside from this, all learning will be done online. However you are welcome to meet up with your group and other people for the course if this is useful to learning or just nice to meet people and socialise!

CEMUS Semester Start-up and Open Events

At CEMUS we start every semester with open, inspirational and introductory conversations for all courses and to a public audience. This semester's start-up conversation will take place on August 30 at 18.15-20.00 where Stefania Barca, Zennström Professor in Climate Change Leadership, Uppsala University will talk about: ""Climate, Covid and the global care crisis: new pathways for a Just Transition" in Lecture hall X of the university main building. In addition, on **September 9 at 16.15-18.00** Uppsala Project Café, will take place (location TBC). You can bring your own ideas and projects or just come and listen (and get involved) in what's going on this autumn semester at CEMUS and beyond. More details on this event will come in due course.

Examination, literature and course structure

The student is examined through written preparation for (4 credits) and active participation in seminars and workshops (3 credits), and through written documentation (7 credits) and oral presentation (1 credit) of a project.



The course is worth 15 credits (ECTS) and is thus given at 50% of a full-time study workload, which equals around 20 hours per week. There will be **no taught classes**. Content will be posted online on the studium page and you will work through this content in groups. There will be assignments for each module that will be graded as pass or fail. At the end of the course, there will be a graded home exam which will give you the opportunity to demonstrate the most interesting things you have learnt and apply it to a topic that inspires you.

Online Environment

The course page in <u>Studium</u> will be the online environment, where we will post all information and updates, share resources, post assignments and assign groups. Please **visit Studium regularly** to make sure you have not missed any important information. You will need an account for Studium, so please arrange one as soon as possible.
