Hello and welcome to CEMUS and the course Actors and Strategies for Change: Towards Global Sustainabilities!

We are your new course coordinators for the upcoming Actors and Strategies course, and we are looking forward to engaging with you through a thought provoking, and inclusive course. Throughout this course it will be filled with questions as to how change happens, what makes you as an individual an actor of change, why some movements work and others don't, and how we can develop capacities, strategies, and tactics that achieve lasting and real changes in the local and global world. Such questions are discussed from different perspectives in the literature chosen for the course, which we will also explore with you to offer diverse forms of knowledge.

The structure of the course consists of the three following modules:

- 1. Theories of Change: We will begin by understanding different theories for how change happens, and situating ourselves as actors in relation to sustainability issues.
- 2. Actors and Strategies: This module will consist of numerous guest lectures, presenting themselves or others as societal actors of change.
- 3. Leading the Change: The final module will focus on the final assignment entitled "Actors in Action" which will be carried out individually, supported by a group presentation.

At the end of the first two modules there will be workshops to discuss the themes of that module, including the topics of the guest lectures and the literature suggested for their lectures.
