## **Course Learning Outcomes**

This course is meant to introduce you the concept of Sustainable Development and to the master's program. The goal is to equip you with methodological, conceptual, personal, and interpersonal skills necessary to critically and constructively engage with the quest of sustainability transformation.

As stated in the syllabus, upon completion of the course, the student should be able to:

- critically relate to disciplinary and interdisciplinary traditions and work methods;
- critically relate to and analyse the history and development of the concept of Sustainable development;
- problematise complexity and sustainable development through a critical analysis of different actors' norms and perspectives

#### **Course Overview**

The course is worth 5 credits and runs for three weeks from Monday 29<sup>th</sup> August until Friday 16<sup>th</sup>





September. There is a **DRAFT** schedule for the course attached. A final schedule will be provided one week before the start of the course on Studium, the online education management system used by Uppsala University, and the course website (<a href="http://www.cemus.uu.se/msd/">http://www.cemus.uu.se/msd/</a>).

The Autumn semester 2022 begins on Monday 29<sup>th</sup> August with an introduction session for the program at 11:00- 12:00, followed by an introduction to the course from 13:15 – 15:00. The teaching consists of lectures, given by guest lecturers from different academic disciplines and other relevant societal sectors, and seminars run by the course coordinators. The teaching method is based on active student participation and peer-to-peer learning.

#### **Course Examination**

As stated in the syllabus:

The student is examined through written preparation for (1 credit) and active participation in seminars and workshops (1 credit), and through written documentation (2.5 credits) and oral presentation (0.5 credits) of a project.

The course is examined through the following mandatory assignments:

- Seminar: Preparation for Final Project; in class, Thursday 1<sup>th</sup> September 2022
- Literature Seminar; in class, Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> September 2022
- Written Documentation of Lit Review Assignment; part 1 due Friday, September 9th; part 2 due Monday September 12th
- Student Presentations of individual project on Thursday 15th September 2022
- Written Documentation of individual project; due Friday 16th September 2022, 23:59

### Course Literature
