Course information

The course is worth 15 credits (ECTS) and is given at 50% of a full-time study workload, which equals to 20 hours per week. Class is most often two afternoons per week, Tuesday and Thursday, for the entire spring semester. The first class session is January 17th and the final session takes place on June 1st.

The semester at CEMUS also starts with an opening lecture with Gabriel Liljenström on Monday, January 16th, which we encourage you to attend! It will take place 18.15-20 in Hambergsalen, Geocentrum, and it is titled "The best news you've never heard of - visions of hope in the Decade of Darkness".
