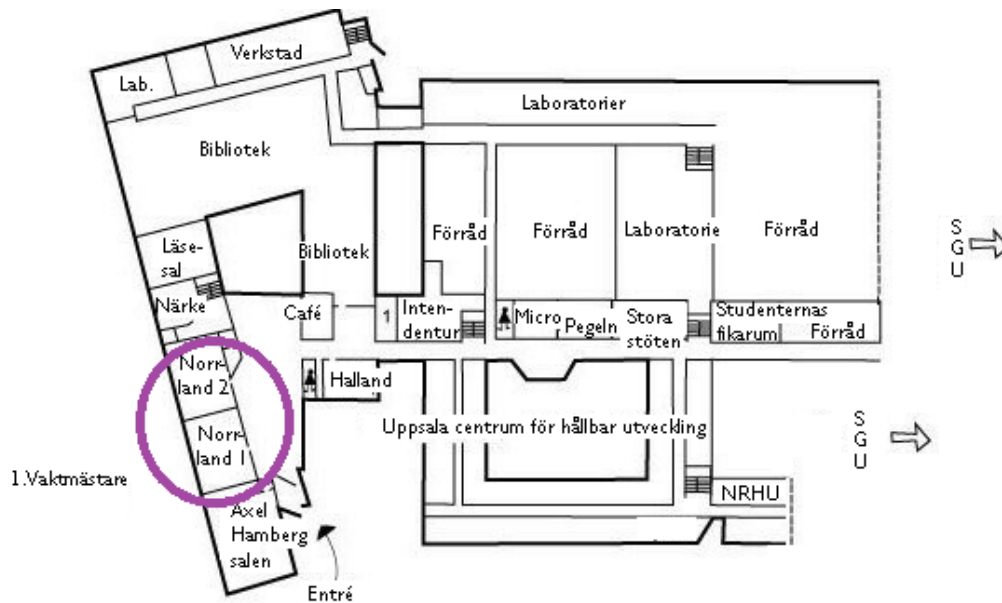

Practical Information

This interdisciplinary course is 7,5 credits (ECTS) and runs as a part-time course, meaning that it is 25% of the full-time study workload. Classes run once a week, every Monday evening (17:15-19:30, sometimes 20:00) throughout the whole Spring semester. The course starts with the course introduction on January 20th and ends with the last session on June 1st. The preliminary schedule is attached to this letter and a definite schedule is posted one week before the course starts.

Note! Even with the definite schedule, there might be small changes throughout the course, but the mandatory sessions are fixed.

All course material will be uploaded on the course webpage; however, all assignments will be handed in on Studentportalen, which you will also need to get access to.

These are the learning outcomes and on completion of the course, you should be able to:

- From cross disciplinary perspective account for today's sustainability issues;
- Describe and evaluate different societal actors' strategies, scope for action and limitations in the pursuit of a sustainable society;
- Reason on individual/actor perspective versus structural/system perspectives on societal change;
- Thoroughly reflect on their own role in the causes and solutions of sustainability issues.

Course literature:

In the course, there will be mandatory articles and visual/audio materials every week to complement content covered in sessions. An online compendium with 1-3 texts, videos, audio files and/or other learning material per week available through the course webpage.

In addition, we will use 5 elective books. In the module 1 the books will be introduced by us and you will choose one to read which will be discussed in a literature seminar in module 3.
